Early Years Department

Caterpillars Class



Caterpillars have had a fantastic first term at The Pines. We have enjoyed using the Forest School area, digging building, swinging in the hammocks and even cooking outside. We have been out in the mini bus exploring the local area and have loved using Early years new climbing frame. This half term we have been thinking about colours and have particularly enjoyed the "Brown Bear Brown Bear What do you see" story. Matching colours and decorating the animals.

Primary Department



1A Class

What a fantastic start 1A have had to the school year, throughout this term the children have built resilience, good communication skills and positive relationships with one another. They showed continued enthusiasm towards learning and always tried their best!

In Literacy, we have been improving our writing skills and letter formation every day and have produced some excellent work. We have also worked on our Reading skills through daily Phonics. In Maths, we have looked at 2D shapes and their features and have now moved to 3D shapes and their features. We are also enjoying looking at number problems. We looked at weather in Geography and how to dress for different seasons, we delved into themes such as belonging and responsibility in PSHE and in D.T we enjoyed food tasting and building our very own class robot!

We also strengthened our speech and language skills by doing weekly sensory sentences and used communication aids to support us with our emotions and behaviour. Our highlights have to be: taking an active part in anti-bullying week and performing our speeches at the Christmas production!



1M Class

1M have had a busy term, our first topic was 'My School and Me,' and we had a lot of fun finding different places within the school. This half term we have been learning about pirates and sea creatures in our topic 'Splish Splash Splosh.' We have continued working on our maths skills, counting pirates in and out of the pirate ship and splashing them into water and making a fish tank from lego bricks! We also counted fish whilst singing the rhyme '1,2,3,4,5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive.' In our English sessions the books we have enjoyed have included the Rainbow Fish, Let's Explore Under the Sea and the poem/ song Ten Little Pirates. We enjoyed playing with the pirate treasure chest and have done some lovely mark making work, making our own glittery treasure chest.

We have enjoyed some lovely Autumn walks out and about in the community. We also visited Pumpkinfest for our Autumn trip to look at all the different pumpkins of many shapes and sizes. This half term we have visited garden centres to look at the fish and also the lights and winter decorations on our more recent visit.

We have been working hard on our play skills, learning to use the toys and resources within the classroom and matching numbers, shapes and our names.

Also we have had a lot of fun getting ready for the Winter production with plenty of sensory play, making snowmen from lots of different media and practicing wearing our snowman costumes!









1S Class

1S started off the term by exploring our senses. We read the book Polar Bear Polar Bear and focused on the sounds we could hear around us, as well as in the story. We have also

listened to some call and response rhymes and joined in with action rhymes! We have loved going out to the forest this term, we toasted some 'witches cone hats' on the fire and we have even been brave enough to hold some wriggly worms!

In PE we have taken part in dance and gymnastics and worked hard to navigate through and over PE apparatus, whilst maintaining our balance! Sometimes it's been tricky, but we have persevered!

2B



2B's topic this term is called 'Explorers'. In our topic lessons we have been thinking about familiar places in our school. This has included labelling different areas around school, such as, the library, dinner hall, playground, sensory room, sports hall etc. In Geography, we looked at the UK flag and we can recognise the UK flag from a collection of flags from around the world. Our favourite book in English this term is 'We All Go Travelling By' by Sheena Roberts. In this story we explored different types of transport. We wrote and used symbols to construct simple sentences about the story. We also looked at sequencing the main events in the story and answered simple questions. In Math's, we explored numbers, counting forwards and backwards and have looked at 2D shapes and their properties. In our PSHE lessons, we have been thinking about our feelings, emotions and our community. 2B are able to recognise a wider range of feelings and emotions. We enjoyed playing simple games and can take turns in a group game with the support of our teachers.



We also enjoyed our Forest School sessions earlier this term. We took part in lots of exciting outdoor activities, which included making hedgehogs out of clay, pumpkin explosions and cooking witches hats on the fire. A big thank you to Sami our Forest School Leader who supported these sessions. 2B have enjoyed working with Charlotte Boyer from the Birmingham Hippodrome. Our Birmingham Hippodrome project was based on the TV show Strictly Come Dancing. We enjoyed learning the hand

jive dance. As the build up to Christmas and the winter season begins – we have had lots of fun with the snow machine and enjoyed dancing to the song Winter Wonderland.







2C Class

This term, 2C have started off the new year extremely well. We have had new friends to get to know and have had some children who are new to school. We have welcomed Lyana and Subhaan into our class and have been helping them settle into life at The Pines. We have learnt about The Romans and found out about life was like in Roman Britain. We made shields, mosaics and even a road made from biscuits! We have also had the opportunity to take part learning different styles of dancing. We did a Strictly Ballroom workshop and worked with the Hippodrome. We also had a great time doing Bhangra dancing. 2P Class



2P have had a fantastic Autumn term. In September, the children got off to a fab start, settling in well to their new classroom and quickly getting to know their new class team. They enjoyed making magic potions, decorating magic wands, and listening to the 'Room on the Broom' sensory story as part of our 'All Things Magic' Topic. They also took part in lots of activities exploring the UK in Geography lessons. We enjoyed using the light up toys and dark tent in Science. After the half term break, 2P started looking at a new topic 'Once Upon a Time,' and have been listening to lots of Nursery Rhymes and fairy tales, particularly enjoying the 'Little Red Riding Hood' sensory story. 2R

This term 2R have enjoyed the topics Around the world in 80 days and Explorers. We have read the stories Simon Sock, The Ant explorer and Winnies amazing Pumpkin. We have also created our very own Atalas' to help others find information about different countries.

We have had so much fun learning about the Ancient Greeks, we really liked sketching pictures of Greek architecture.





In November we were stars of the show as we went to perform at the hippodrome as part of our HEN school project. We danced the Cha Cha in front of over 50 children from different schools.

2H ###

Our topic in 2H this term has been 'once upon a time' and we have been looking at traditional fairytales, in particular The Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have loved taking part in a range of activities relating to our book; using apples, marshmallows and caramel spread to create



goats teeth, making paper plate trolls and using colourful semantics to describe what we can see in the picture book.

In science, we have been looking at magnets and forces. We have enjoyed using different magnets to investigate everyday items. We have also been exploring push and pull forces; using wooden slopes to push and pull cars was a clear class favourite!

Our focus in History has been the Anglo Saxons; we have used

different printing techniques to create our masks, shields and swords. We also had a go at making and tasting traditional anglo saxon foods such as gruel and vegetable soup.

In RSHE, we have looked at celebrating differences. Our focus in class has been celebrating each others families. We have worked hard on recognising our family members and re creating their portraits using arts and crafts.







2M



We have been very busy in our new class, this term.

English

We have had two topics in English this term. Our first was 'We are all Different. For this topic, we enjoyed listening to the story of Elmer the elephant, engaging in lots of sensory mark making activities and practicing our pencil control.

Our other topic this term is 'The Great Outdoors'. This term, we enjoyed the non-fiction book 'My London Alphabet' where we practiced our letter sounds and alphabet skills by matching symbols to their corresponding letters. Some of us even had a go at ordering the alphabet!

We have also enjoyed listening to the rhyme 'London's Burning'. We have been engaging well in our Attention Autism sessions, listening to the rhyme and having a go at putting the fire out in stage 3!





Maths

In Maths, we have been busy requesting more, recognizing and ordering numbers, counting how many there are in a set and finding the corresponding number on our PECS strip to label it. Some of us have also had a go at adding to 10, using different objects for support. We have also enjoyed choosing and listening to different number rhymes this term. Our favorites have been 5 currant buns, 5 Little Firemen and 5 Flying Men.

In Shape Space and Measure, we have enjoyed a variety of shapes themed Attention Autism sessions. We have engaged in construction activities, have been on a hunt identifying different shapes in the environment and have been giving adults a named shaped from a sensory tray, when asked.



ICT/Computing

In ICT this term, we have been following simple instructions around the classroom, with symbol support. This includes sitting, jumping, standing, clapping, crawling and rolling, We have also been enjoyed the website HelpKidzLearn, where we have been practicing our touch skills with our favourite cause and effect games.







2F



2F have had a busy Autumn term. First half term our topic was Dinosaurs. The children made dinosaurs sculptures in Art using clay and mod-roc. In Science we looked at fossils and rocks. In Geography the children enjoyed exploring the coastlines of the UK. Aston villa came in to do a STEM workshop and the children practiced their coding skills. We celebrated the life of our late Queen Elizabeth. Charlotte from the Open Theatre came in to work with us, the production was 'Strictly Ballroom'. Second half term we celebrated Black History in our first week back. Our topic is 'Come Dine with Me' and in DT we have done lots of cooking and looked at healthy eating. In History we have looked at Victorian life in school and home and compared to modern times. In Science we have explored and experimented with forces and magnets. For Remembrance Day we observed the twominute silence and remembered the lives of those we have lost. The children have really enjoyed swimming this term and have made great progress. Everyone was enthusiastic when practicing and performing in The Winter Spectacular.





This term, our topics have been All Things Magical and Once Upon a Time. The children have all settled really well into Class 2W and had a super term, forming new friendships and learning lots of exciting things.

In the first half term, we mixed potions and read lots of stories about witches and magical creatures.



We explored light and dark for science and really enjoyed trying on clothes with reflective strips and shining torches on them to test how effective they would be at keeping us safe at night. We also looked at maps of the United Kingdom and learnt the names of the UK countries and their capital cities. This term, we have been reading the story of Cinderella. We have looked at the characters and thought of different words to describe them. We decided that the step-sisters were unkind and lazy, whilst Cinderella was lonely and busy. At the end she was happy, which we were pleased about!

In science, we have been investigating forces.

We tested cars on different surfaces and measured how far they moved. We have been finding out how the Anglo Saxons lived in history and we have especially enjoyed exploring the forest school area.

2W have worked very hard this term and made our teachers very proud. Well done 2W!







Secondary Department



3S Class 🛔



3S have worked very hard this term. Most of 3S are new to Pines school and have all settled in well into their new school and classes with amazing support from fellow pupils that have moved into secondary from primary. We have enjoyed a number of topics across the term. During English our topics have been 'Wild at Heart' and 'Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.' It has given us the opportunity to explore and read the books Stig of the Dump written by Clive King and One Plastic Bag by Mirander Paul. We have had the opportunity to explore and develop our understanding of how we can better look after our planet and the small changes we can make at home to help stop climate change. In art we have been learning about the art works of Picasso and explored replicating some of his work. We have also explored how to weave paper and have created a Christmas tree weaving paper and working collectively as a class. In 3S we really enjoy science and have developed our understanding of different states of matter and separating mixtures. We had a lot of fun in the science lab discovering the best way we can separate different solutions. Our favourite was definitely using the Bunsen burners to separate our salt water solution by boiling and evaporation. In RE we have been comparing different religions and their practices. We all contributed ideas on different religions in class that we wanted to learn about, and we have also been exploring Christianity and Belonging. During ICT we have been discovering how to collect data and create spread sheets using Excel and its features. We have had a wonderful first term from 3S!









3C Class

3C have worked really hard this term. Our topics have been based on Life Cycles and Material Monsters. In English we've had great fun with Attention Autism and Sensory Sentences to help us with or work and we've also enjoyed lots of different books both on the whiteboard and in our hands. Maths has been very practical and we have used it to try to help us understand everyday problems including how to share, how to buy things and how many chairs can be safely stacked at the end of the day.

We have done well in PSHE looking at ourselves and the similarities and differences between people and at how we can look after our environment such as emptying the paper recycling and filling Colin the compost heap with (yes – you guessed it) compost. In History we have looked at the toys from the past and also how people lived long ago and in Geography we have been exploring our own area and the contrasting area of Australia. This has meant that most weeks we have had a visit out, either walking, or on the minibus to help us become more aware of our surroundings and the area in which we come to school. 3C do love a journey! If you add cooking, sewing, finding out about materials and their properties, growing herbs and plants, balloon tennis and breakdancing to our list of "can do's" you'll see we've had a great term.

3F Class



This term 3F In Science we have studied different life cycles (humans/animals and insects). We loved learning about them and had in-depth discussions every lesson as well as lots of work to complete. We studied each life cycle and the series of changes that the members of a species undergo as they pass from the beginning of a given developmental stage to the inception of that same developmental stage in a subsequent generation. We are currently studying the Earth and beyond and love learning about this. During these lessons we find out about interesting facts such as the days are getting longer because of climate change. We're now wondering if school days will be getting longer! We are watching you Ms Pearce! We also recognise how we play a big role in looking after our planet even though we are individuals, if we all do the correct thing the world will be a better place.

In Maths we have been studying place value amongst other categories. Some of us have been learning the value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens and ones). Some three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones) and others four-digit number (thousands, hundreds, tens, and ones). We also studied shape, so we now can identify lines of symmetry in 2-D and 3-D shapes presented in different orientations. We also know the properties of each shape (faces/vertices and edges). In English we have been writing poems and learning about the different types of poems we could write. Also we have learned how to use both familiar and new punctuation correctly, including full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks, question marks, commas for lists and apostrophes for contracted forms and the possessive (singular). We have then practised this in a story that we have written independently. We are all proud of our stories.

Within class cooking is definitely one of our favorite lessons. We love the practical, the eating and learning about nutrition in general. This term we have learnt about the different vitamins and minerals our body needs to stay healthy. We understand it is really important to have a colorful and varied diet to stop disease and sickness.



Towards the end of term we planted tulips in the allotment for community week. This is a week that celebrates the positive changes we can make for others around us. We believe by planting colourful flowers it will make the environment beautiful and more pleasant for others. While we were there we did some weeding for the same reason. As a class we understand that if we can make little changes to our environment and the people around us, they will turn into bigger changes and make a huge impact on others.







3H Class



Our topic this term has been 'material monsters'. In English we looked in detail at the story 'We are going to find the monster', we really enjoyed reading this book and exploring the places through a sensory story. All children were able to re-tell parts of the story, which showed our ability to listen and recall. In maths, we have continued to build our skills in geometry and number! In science we have explored and learnt about different materials; which are objects are made from each one and why. In art, we found out about tessellations and had go at creating some ourselves. In geography, we have explored Australia and compared it to the UK, in terms of the weather, animals, currency and lots more! The industrial revolution has been the focus in History; we learnt about farming, coal mining and housing a long time ago, it was very different! In cooking we have followed recipes, worked in pairs and tasted new foods. Jazz was the genre we have been looking at in music, we have practiced playing the drums and pianos to make our own compositions. We have visited the donkey sanctuary on a weekly basis to learn about animal care and take part in practicing life skills within this area. We really liked walking the donkeys and preparing some food for them to enjoy. As part of our reward trip, we went to the local café where we enjoyed a lovely lunch, which we ordered and paid for ourselves.









3K Class



3K have had a lovely Autumn Term. In Science we have looked at different types of animals and where they live and also classifying solids, liquids and gases. The children have enjoyed melting chocolate to see the different states of matter. In Geography we have looked at Sweden and China. The children have experienced the cultures of these countries and especially enjoyed trying Swedish and Chinese food. 3K have also had the opportunity to visit Forest School this term. The children have enjoyed hunting for bugs and big and small objects. Some of the boys have found some very very big things!!







3R Class



During the term, we have looked at the History and Geography of Birmingham. We have compared what life was like in Victorian times up until now. We have explored housing, clothes, toys and much more. We have located places of interest within Birmingham and as a class, we are able to identify the purposes of these places with ease.

In Science we have explored habitats and food chains. We looked at land and water animals and have sequenced the food chain order. We even discovered the food chain from grass to human (beef burger)!!! More recently, we took a deeper dive into chemistry studying materials in Science.

We have enjoyed learning Boccia in PE and the interactive entertainment in Open Theatre. We also explored 'Picasso and Cubism' in Art and created our own masterpiece using 2D shapes.

They also looked at separating mixtures by different methods i.e. chromatography, evaporation, condensing, filtering. They did some practical work in the science laboratory to separate the mixtures.

In food technology they have cooked lots of different dishes including, courgette muffins, biscuits, tuna pasta salad. They all enjoy tasting the products at the end of the lesson.

It has been a good term and they have all learnt a lot. We are looking forward to the next half term and changing our topics.













4W Class



In year 11 the class have been working incredibly hard towards Entry level and GCSE qualifications all term. They have analysed *A Christmas Carol* in detail, participated in a range of biology experiments and wrestled with mathematical problems linked to Pythagoras' theorem, Trigonometry and

probability. The young people have also made huge steps forward to develop their skills in Art, Food and ICT.

Following all of this industry, 4W have also been embracing Christmas. They have helped plan and prepare for the Christmas Fayre and this week enjoyed a festive trip around the German Christmas Market, where they sampled hot chocolates and rode on the Carousel.

Speech and Language Therapy (SALT) News



AAC Awareness "Show your Voice"

October was AAC awareness month. For those who don't know, AAC is an acronym for Augmentative and Alternative Communication. In simple terms, this means any form of communication which helps (augments) or replaces (alternative) speech. This year's theme for AAC awareness is "Show your voice." People of all ages can use AAC if they have difficulty with speech or language skills. In our profession, we are privileged to work alongside many of these individuals to ensure they have a concrete system to ensure their voice is heard!



There are lots of different types of AAC.

- Unaided (no tech): signing, gesture, Signposting to broaden body language, facial expression.
- · Aided: which can be broken down into:

Low-tech: i.e objects of reference, or paper-based systems such Communication Books, Communication Boards, PODDs, PECS.

Hi-tech: i.e. VOCA's (voice output communication aids) or SGD's (speechgenerating devices)

Occupational Therapy (OT)



Occupational Therapy at The Pines seeks to provide support and advice to the teaching teams to support pupils to access the vast array of learning and play opportunities provided and ensure that any identified motor skill difficulties or sensory processing differences do not create barriers to learning.

This term we have had a focus on supporting pupils increase their tolerance and acceptance of a range of foods. Some classes run sensory food groups and messy play activities using edible items, other class use the steps to eating process to encourage pupils to touch, smell, kiss, lick and eventually taste new foods. We know that food and eating is a subject that many families can find difficult so we attach a link for a webinar that offers an introduction to the SOS (Sensory Oral Sequential) approach to feeding that parents and carers may find beneficial. https://sosapproachtofeeding.com/start-here-parents/

For issue outside of school, there is also the advice line for the NHS paediatric occupational therapy service, which is part of the universal offer, which supports with giving early help to families. This service can be accessed without a referral. Families will be able to discuss any specific difficulties with a Senior Occupational Therapist. The Therapist will be able to provide practical advice, strategies and support in relation to a child's independence skills within everyday activities. The advice line is available Monday to Friday, from 09.00 to 16.00 hours, for children aged 0 - 18 years (up to 19 years if in full time special school education) and registered with a Birmingham GP.
