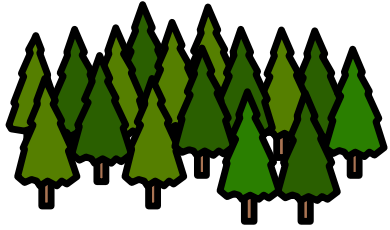
Our lunchtime clubs offer activities outside the curriculum for students to develop skills, broaden their experiences in their personal areas of interest and socialise with friends whilst having fun.

Our lunchtime club offering starts in Key Stage 1 and runs through into Key Stage 4.

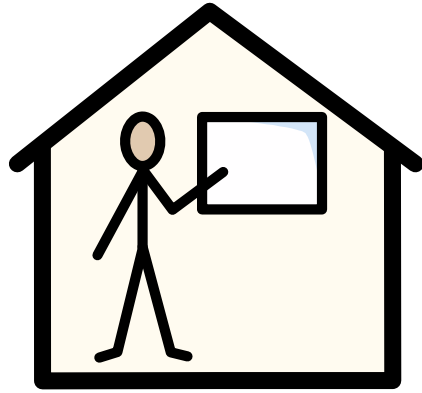
Each term the students get to choose which club(s) they would like to attend and commit to this for the term.

Pupil Voice is used at the end of each term to determine which clubs will run the following term.

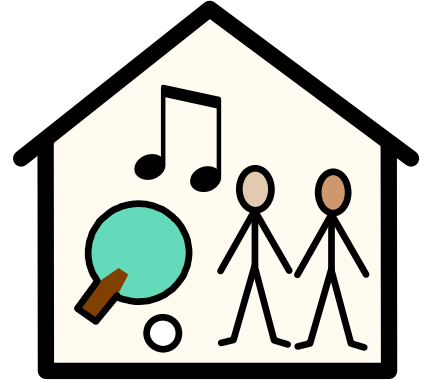

Focus: Pupils will learn resilience, persistence and discipline in our obstacle course club.

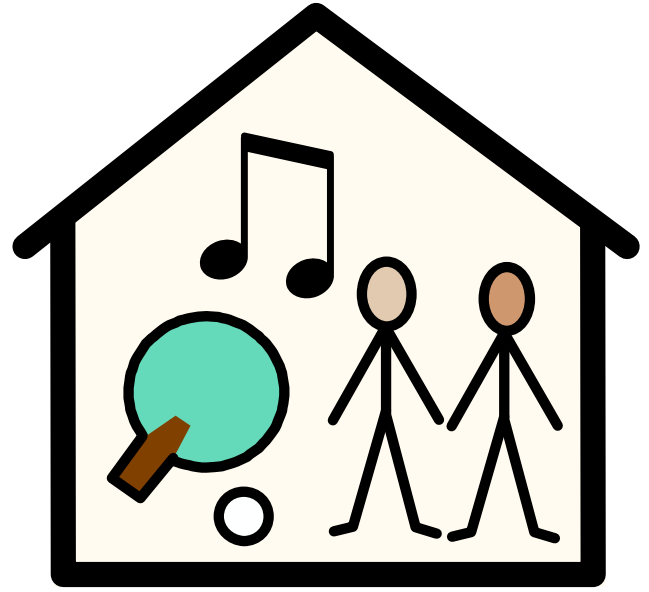
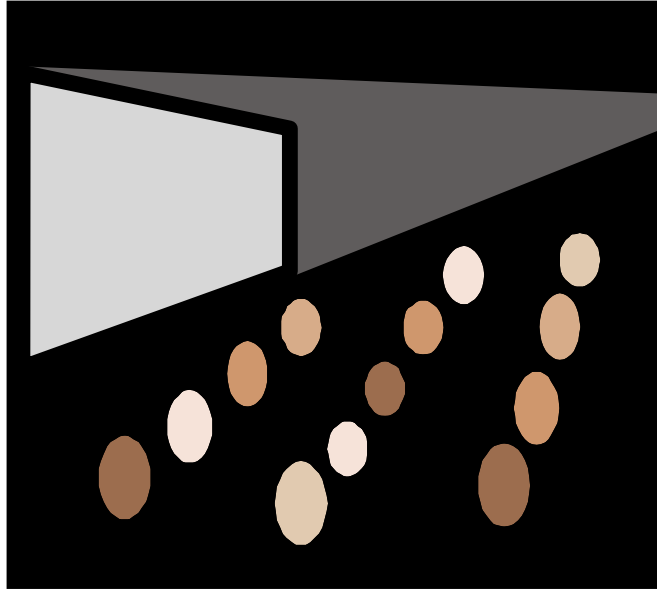
Pupils will tackle different obstacles of varying levels. Pupils will be able to choose which obstacles they would like to tackle and will be supported to step out of their comfort zone.

Focus: In Movie Club we start off the term by voting for the films we would like to watch. The most popular film will be the film we watch together.

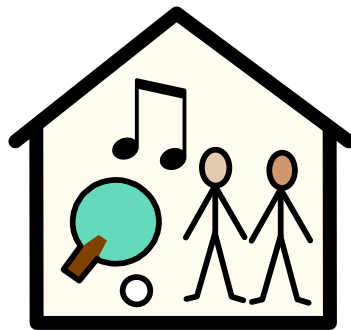


Sensory Club

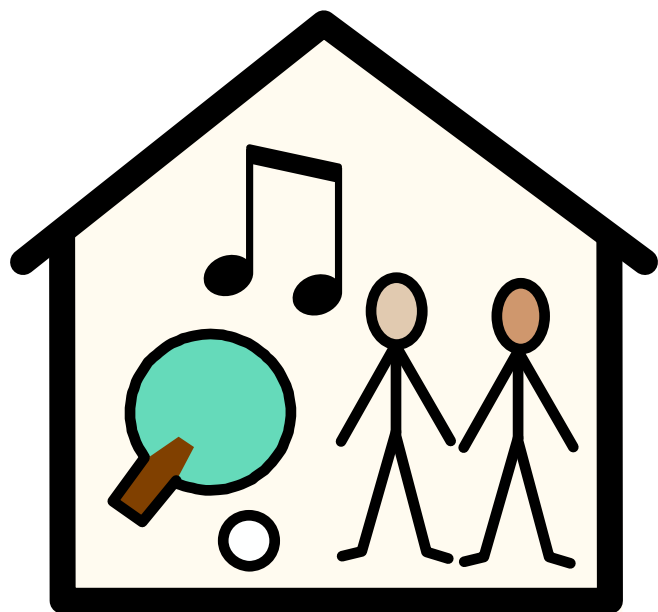
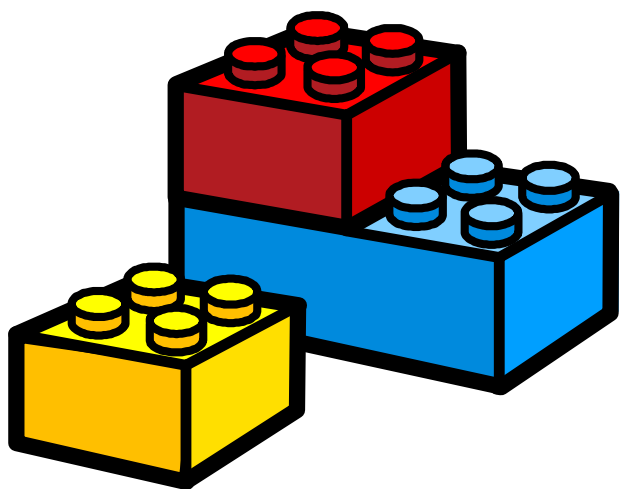


Relaxation and Yoga

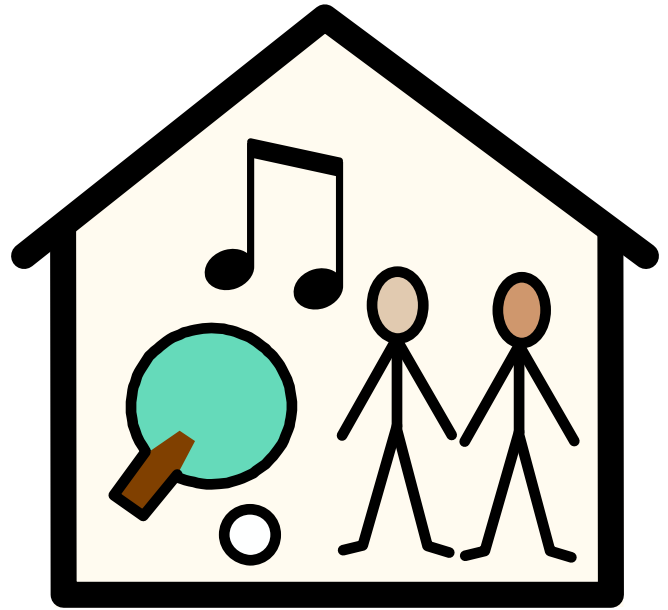
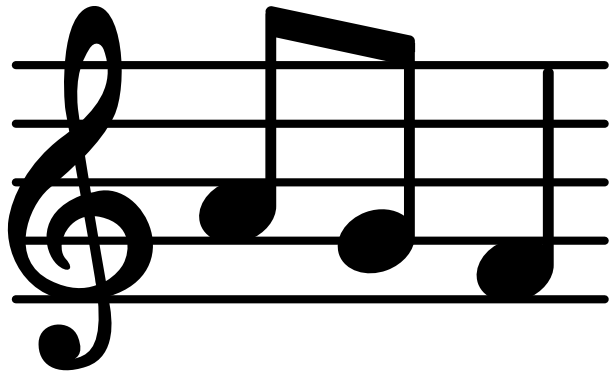
Focus: Relaxation and yoga club

Club

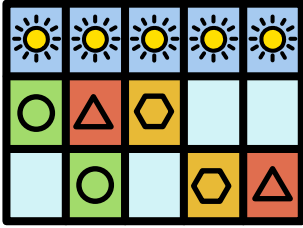
Focus: Lego club is an opportunity for our Lego enthusiasts to get together and build. Lego club encourages us to share and communicate whilst doing something we love.

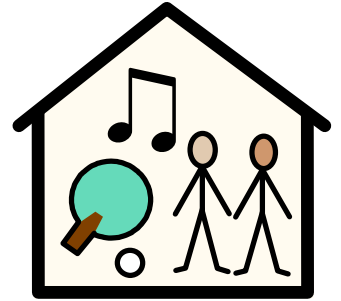
Focus: Music Club allows our pupils to access music at their own level and gives them the opportunity to play instruments and explore music making technology.

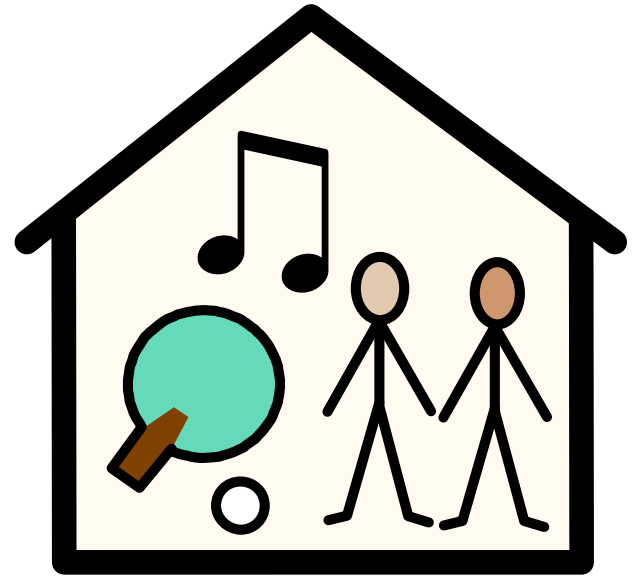
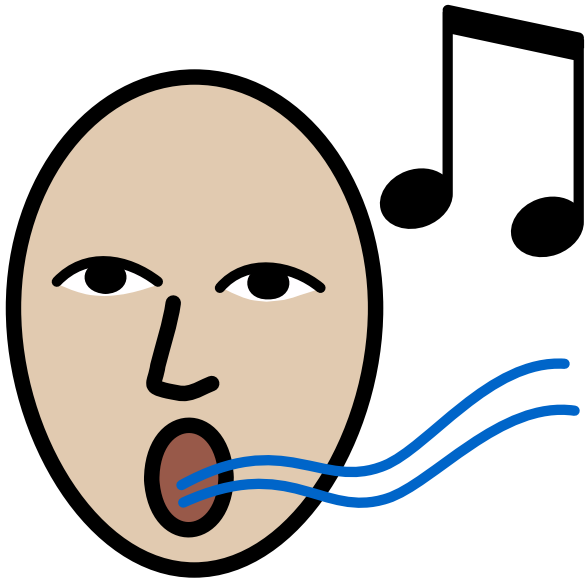

Focus: Times Tables Rock Stars club is an opportunity for our pupils who enjoy maths to play TTRS on the computers. Times Tables

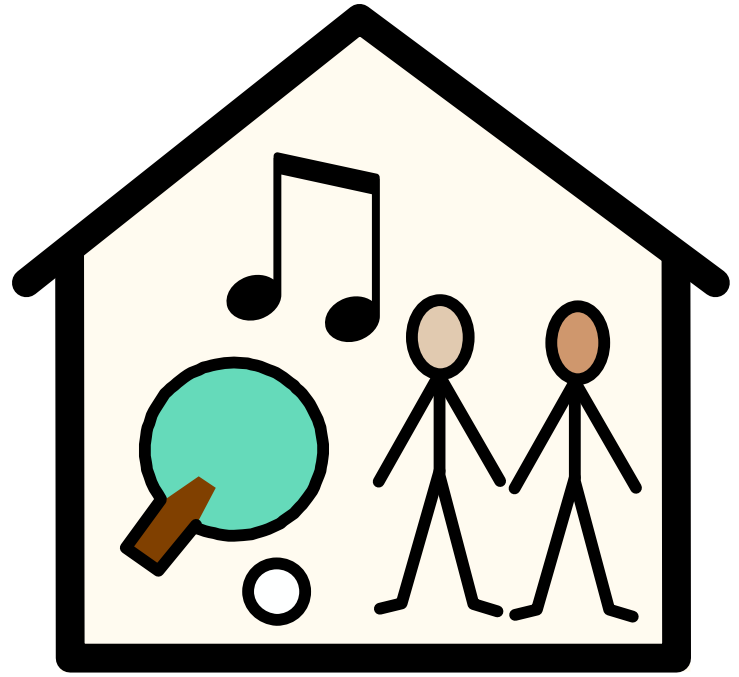
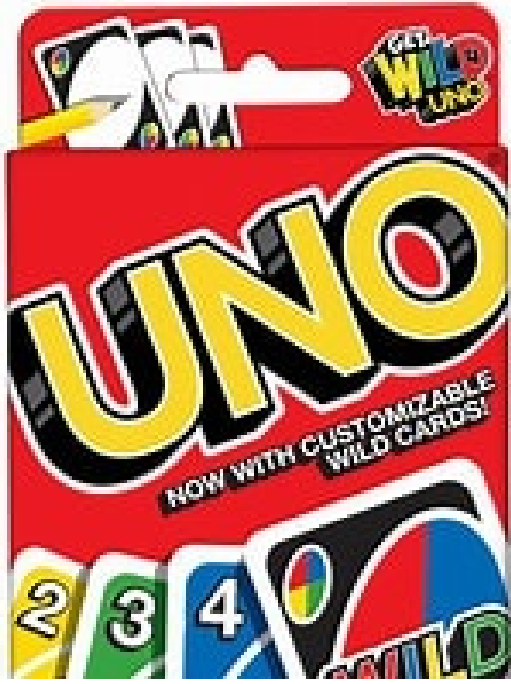
Rock Stars is a programme that helps children learn and practise their times tables with games, rewards and leaderboards.

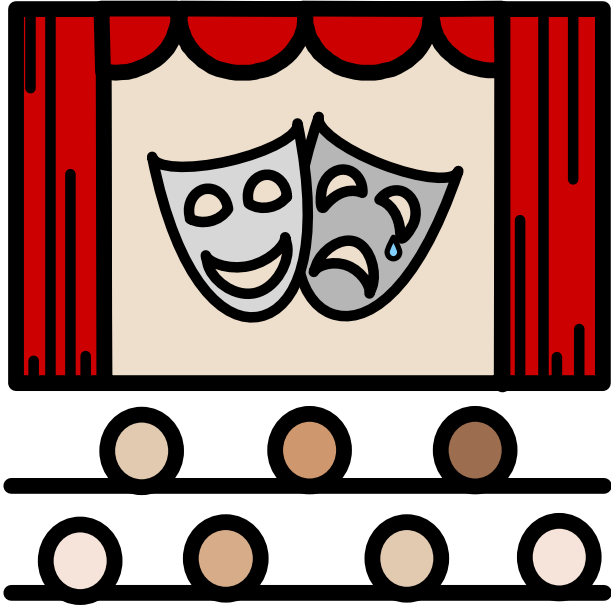
Focus: Singing club is a club run by our artist facilitator from the Hippodrome. Our pupils have the opportunity to work with an external person singing their favourite songs.



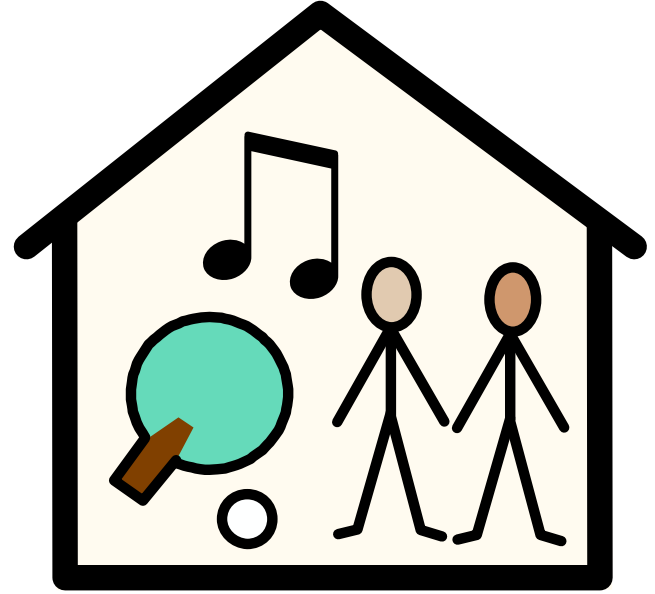
Uno

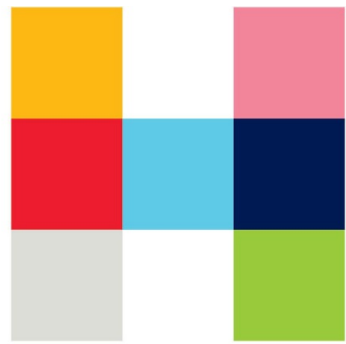

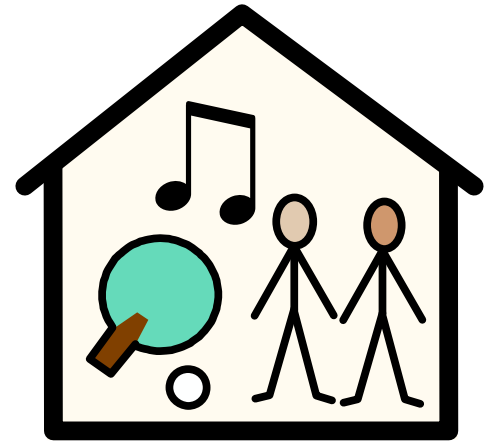

Focus: Drama club offers our pupils the opportunity to practise their drama skills by playing games, reading and performing playscripts and building their confidence.

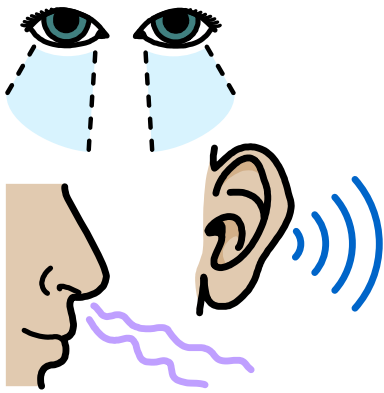

Hippodrome Club

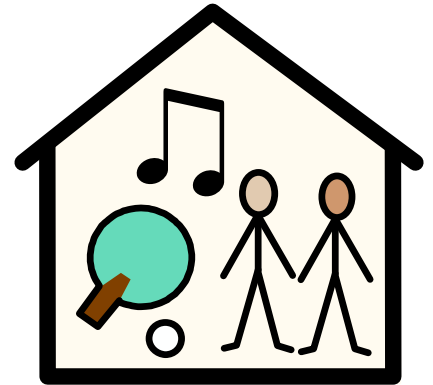

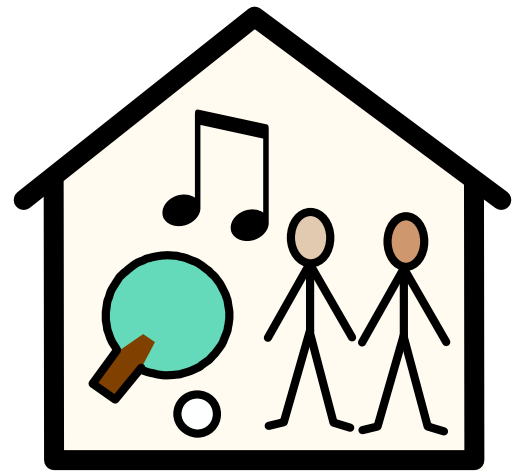

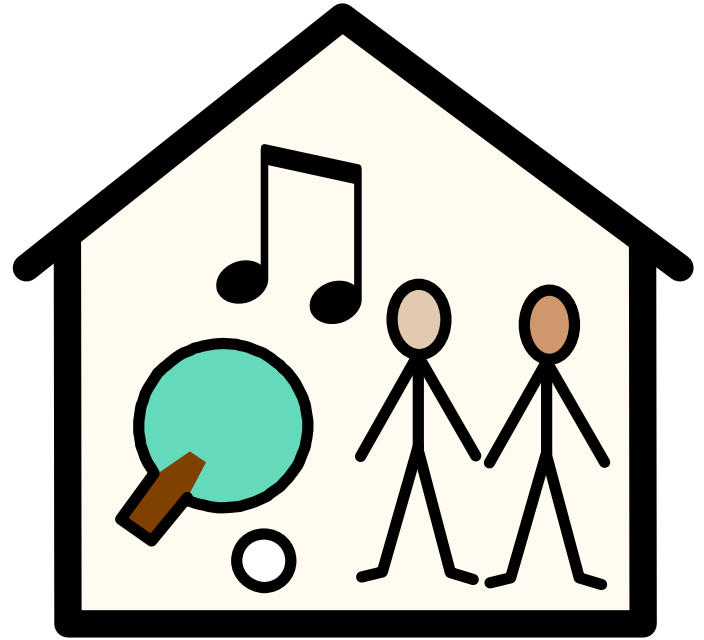
Focus: Sensory art club allows our pupils to get creative. Pupils can choose from a variety of Art and craft activities such as colouring, painting, collaging and making.

Computing Club

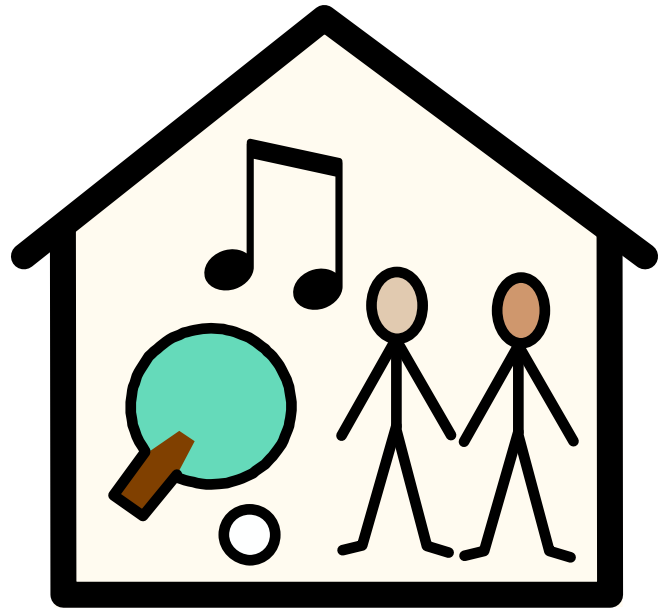
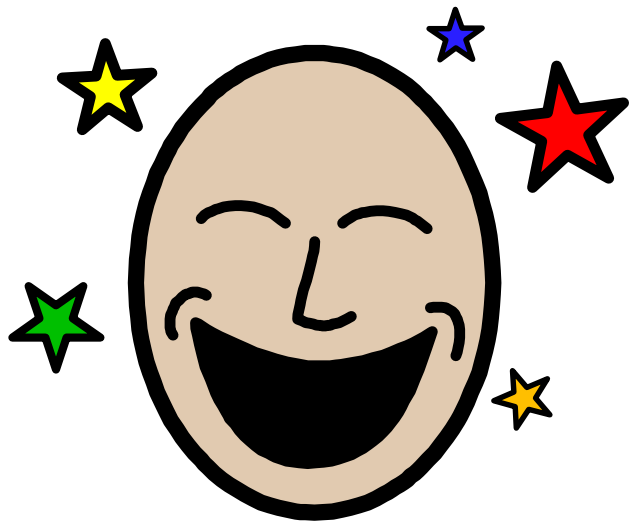
